Job summary

As the Policy and Campaigns Senior Officer (Devolved Nations), and with the support of the Head of External Affairs (Devolved Nations), you'll be responsible for the development, monitoring, and support of the implementation of policy positions and campaigns in order to influence public policy and legislation on health services which impact the lives of people affected by bowel cancer in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.



Main responsibilities

Policy development and monitoring

- Carry out comprehensive horizon scanning across the devolved nations to identify policy areas relevant to the organisations objectives and strategic priorities
- Maintain an understanding and knowledge base of policy issues affecting people diagnosed with bowel cancer within the UK (with a particular focus on Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland) and Government policies that are likely to have impact
- Monitor and provide timely updates and briefings on key policy developments related to the organisations policy priority areas; proactively identify opportunities to further our policy agenda and support plans to maximise these opportunities
- Support the development of evidence-based policy positions in priority areas, ensuring that these are in line with emerging knowledge, political landscape and patient experience, to influence the policy agenda in each devolved nation
- Ensure people affected by bowel cancer are effectively involved in the development of our policy positions and responses through one to one meetings, focus groups, interviews and surveys

Influencing, strategy and planning

- Support the delivery of comprehensive strategies on policy and influencing activities in the devolved nations
- Work to establish influencing priorities for the charity, and support processes such as annual team planning, budget forecasts and the creation of organisational strategies
- Work on the development and support the delivery of a light touch campaigns and public affairs activity to effectively grow and mobilise our supporter base and support our influencing goals
- Undertake comprehensive evaluation of policy and influencing projects and ensure any learnings are disseminated and taken forward

Policy engagement and communications

- Producing high quality and accurate policy reports, briefings and papers to influence improvements to the diagnosis, treatment and management of people affected by bowel cancer in the devolved nations. Help draft consultation responses, making a robust and evidence-based case for the charity's position
- Build effective relationships with key external stakeholders in devolved governments, NHS/HSC, public health agencies, and with other organisations,



including clinical advisors, and represent Bowel Cancer UK at meetings and conferences as required

- Work with the Communications and Digital team to ensure that the organisation's
 policy positions are well communicated externally, assisting in drafting press
 releases, statements and content for website and other communication channels as
 required
- Work closely with colleagues in fundraising and services, in each devolved nation, to ensure opportunities for cross-organisation collaboration are identified and maximised

- Keep informed of current developments in the field of cancer/colorectal cancer in relation to Policy and Campaigns
